

## Signs of Depression and How to Help

### **Emotional Signs**

- Persistent sadness, irritability, or frequent mood swings
- Loss of interest in activities they used to enjoy
- Frequent feelings of hopelessness or worthlessness

### **Behavioral Signs:**

- Withdrawal from friends, family, or school
- Changes in sleep (too much or too little)
- · Changes in appetite or weight
- Decline in academic performance
- Increased risk-taking or self-harm behaviors



### **Physical Signs:**

- Fatigue or low energy
- Headaches, stomachaches, or other unexplained aches
- Restlessness or difficulty concentrating

### How to talk about it

**Start the conversation gently –** Use observations, e.g., "I've noticed you seem sad lately. Do you want to share how you're feeling?"

**Listen actively** – Give them your full attention without interrupting or judging.

Validate their feelings – Let them know it's okay to feel this way: "It's normal to feel upset sometimes, and I'm here for you."

Use simple, age-appropriate language – Avoid clinical terms with younger children; keep explanations relatable.

**Encourage sharing, don't pressure** – Allow them to open up at their own pace.

Offer reassurance and support – Remind them they are not alone and help is available.



### What adults can do to help:

### Parents / Guardians:

- Maintain routine and stability at home
- Encourage healthy habits: sleep, nutrition, physical activity
- Seek professional support (pediatrician, counselor, mental health worker)

### Teachers / School Staff:

- Notice changes in behavior or performance
- Provide a safe, supportive classroom environment
- Connect families to school counselors or support programs

### **Community Workers / Support Staff:**

- Listen and validate feelings without judgment
- Offer resources and referrals to mental health services
- Encourage participation in community activities that foster connection


