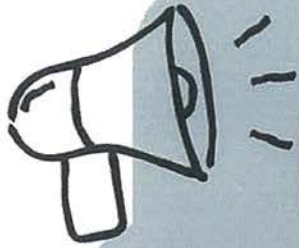

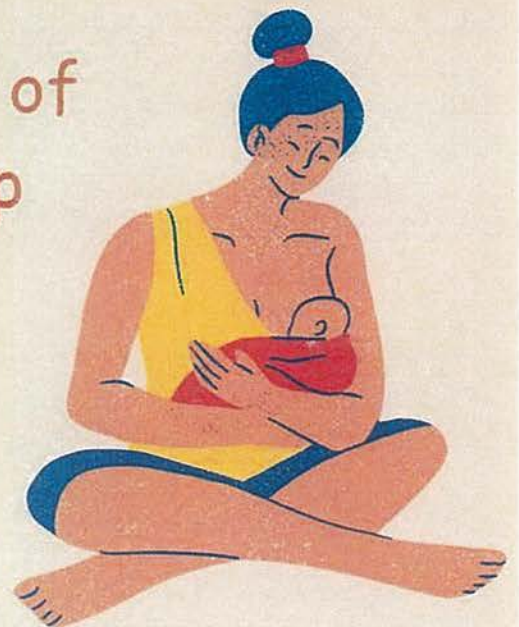

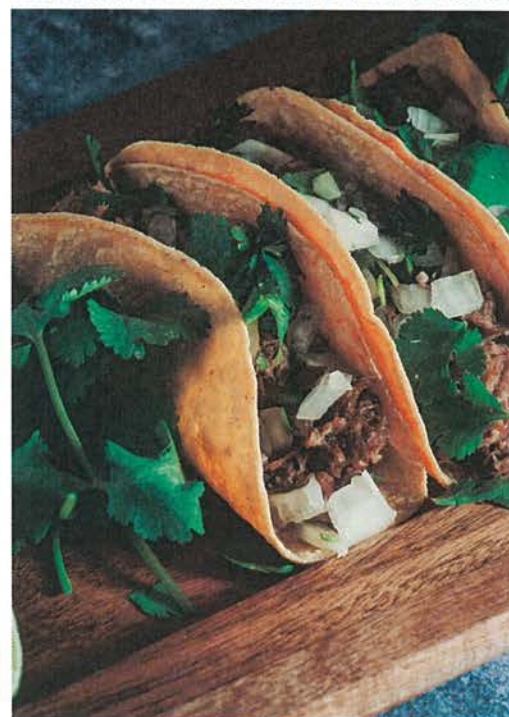

- Additional participants are welcome (travel costs to be covered by the community).

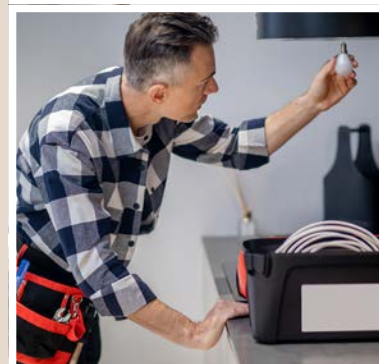

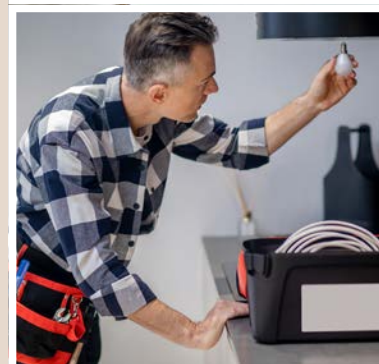
